## **LEGISLATION UPDATE**



## HOUSE BILL 281 — MENTAL HEALTH AND DISABILITY TERMINOLOGY ACT

Rep. Jarrells went before the House Health Committee this month and gave sponsor testimony on his alongside his colleague and joint sponsor, Rep. Tom Young as he advocated for **House Bill 281**.

House Bill 281 replaces derogatory language related to people with disabilities and updates statutory provisions relating to assistance dogs, braille teacher standards, the Children with Medical Handicaps Program, and accessible parking spaces. This legislation is a comprehensive update to the terminology regarding mental health and disabilities in the Ohio Revised Code.

Rep. Jarrells hearing for H.B. 281 was comprised of six proponent testimonies coming from many organizations representing many advocates and members of Ohio's disability community such as Deaf World Against Violence Everywhere, Mental Health America Ohio, Ohio Association of County Behavioral Health, and more. We are expecting a second hearing for this legislation in the coming weeks.

## HOUSE BILL 316 - 2020-2021 HIGH SCHOOL EDUCATION RECOVERY ACT

Understanding the detrimental affect COVID-19 had on students this past school year, Rep. Jarrells worked with his colleague Rep. Hillyer to propose emergency legislation— **House Bill 316**, also known as the 2020 -2021 High School Education Recovery Act. This legislation allows any high school student who worked towards a high school credit during the 2020-2021 school year to have the option to use the upcoming 2021-2022 school year as a supplemental year to retake or supplement courses the student already has taken.

It would also require public and chartered nonpublic schools to replace course grades on students' transcripts with the grades received for those courses that are retaken or supplemented through the program. This bill was referred to the Primary and Secondary Committee and had its first hearing.
