I voted in support of **House Bill 23**, the Ohio Transportation Budget, which was passed out of the House in Session. This budget is crucial for creating new jobs and ensuring railway safety here in Ohio. I am proud of the strong bipartisan support it received.

My legislation with Assistant Minority Whip Tavia Galonski to create a statewide AAPI Commission, House Bill 25, has been referred to the State and Local Committee. I am hopeful I will be able to provide sponsor testimony on this soon.

I recently filed **House Bill** 72 with Representative Adam Mathews to designate October as Hindu Heritage Month. This legislation would allow us to recognize and celebrate the contributions of Hindu Americans in Ohio.

Speaker Jason Stephens held a press conference to announce his priority bills for this General Assembly. These priorities include bipartisan pieces of legislation that will empower Ohio families. Among these are:

- House Bill 3: Authorize an affordable housing tax credit
- House Bill 9: Establish a loan repayment program for teachers
- House Bill 10: Continue funding the Fair School Funding Plan

However, the Speaker continues to also prioritize legislation that hurts working families and instigates culture wars. These include:

- House Bill 1: Large tax cuts targeting the wealthy. This will result in a \$1.2 billion loss in money for local governments, including public schools. Lowering taxes like this bill proposes will lower the amount of funding for schools. This contrasts with Governor DeWine's goal to prioritize early child literacy and school funding.
- House Bill 6: Bans transgender girls from playing on female teams in high school and college. This bill is similar to the legislation introduced last General Assembly, but it does not specify how a student's sex would be determined.
- House Joint Resolution 1: Raise the percentage needed to pass a constitutional amendment to 60%
