Dear District 14 Resident:

As State Representative, it is my duty to ensure that my constituents are informed about matters that directly affect them. As such, I have important news to share regarding unclaimed funds in the Ohio Department of Commerce Division of Unclaimed Funds that may belong to you or a family member.

The Division of Unclaimed Funds is responsible for safeguarding funds that have been left unclaimed by individuals and organizations. These funds could be from various sources, such as forgotten bank accounts, insurance policies, utility deposits, uncashed checks, unclaimed casino winnings, and more.

My Statehouse office has been working diligently with the Department to identify residents within the district who might be entitled to unclaimed funds. As you can imagine, the verification process is a very time consuming task, especially due to residents moving, passing away, and other variables. So, to ensure that everyone in the district can find out if they are entitled to any unclaimed funds, I thought that I would dedicate this month's front page column to the procedure that is simple to do on your own.

To initiate the process please follow these steps:

- 1.) Visit the official website for the Division of Unclaimed Funds at: com.ohio.gov/divisions-and-programs/unclaimed-funds
- 2.) Use the provided search function on the website to enter your name and other relevant details.
- 3.) Review the search results carefully and identify the claims associated with your name.
- 4.) Follow the instructions provided on the website to submit your claim.

I wish you the best of luck in reclaiming any unclaimed funds that may be due to you or a loved one. In fact, if you are able to identify any funds to which you are entitled, I would be very happy to know, so please feel free to contact me to let me know. Further, if you require any assistance, please do not hesitate to reach out to my office. Best wishes for a Happy Halloween!

State Rep. Brennan Announces Funding for Afterschool Enrichment Programs

State Representative Sean Patrick Brennan (Parma) has announced that the State of Ohio is now accepting applications for the 2023 – 2024 Ohio Afterschool Enrichment (ACE) Educational Savings Account program. The program provides families with a \$1,000 credit per child (ages 6-18) that can be used for a variety of educational enrichment activities, such as before- and after-school educational programs, day camps for academics, music, and the arts, curriculum and materials for homeschool families, educational, learning, or skills services, tuition for learning extension centers, field trips to historical landmarks, museums, science centers, and theaters, including admission, exhibit, and program fees, language classes, music lessons, tutoring, and many other programs.

I also know how expensive it can be. That is why I am happy to support the Afterschool Childhood Enrichment (ACE) Education Saving Program.”
